Currently the waiting list has been fulfilled. Since the pandemic, we have a substantial reserve of outside male/female correspondents; we continue to welcome male/female volunteers, but we inform them that there may be a wait of several months before they can be linked with inmates.

# VIDEO

• A local corrections committee created a video combining their public service announcement, "Sobriety in A.A.: Opening Doors to a Life Without Drinking" with the 3:57 minute version of "A New Freedom." The video was broadcast throughout the facility.

# LITERATURE

- Female inmates were given access to the Grapevine issues that were available for free during the pandemic.
- Administrative staff allowed literature to be dropped off.
- A large quantity of books was purchased for when the facilities re-open.
- Correction chairs have supplied all chaplains with literature.
- Packets of G.S.O. pamphlets with meeting resources (local directories, website information and Meeting Guide information) were prepared for inmates once the facility re-opens.

# TABLETS FOR INMATES

• The Corrections department provided female inmates tablets in order to access approved A.A. stories.

# **ZOOM MEETINGS**

- The Administrative Staff assisted in establishing videoconference A.A. meetings.
- The jail in Franklin County has begun videoconference meetings for inmates.
